# THE STORY

#### PLEASE NOTE THIS SECTION CONTAINS SPOILERS

The story of Choir Boy follows Pharus, a student in an all-boys elite American school. He leads his school choir, and loves to sing gospel hymns and spirituals. His dream is to sing at his own commencement at the end of the school year. Throughout the play, there are moments when the characters sing on stage.

In the opening scene, Pharus is hurt when his classmate Bobby uses a homophobic and racial slur against him, during a choir performance. The story then follows Pharus as he makes his way through the school year, along with his friend and roommate, AJ. Some scenes take place in the Headmaster's office and some in the classroom with Mr Pendleton, a retired teacher who has returned to the school to lead a course in "thinking".

Bobby continues to be unkind to Pharus. In the first Act, the audience also finds out that Bobby has recently lost his Mother.

In the school choir there is also JR, who is friends with Bobby, although feels unsure about the way he

is treating Pharus. There is also David, and in the Second Act we find out that David and Pharus are in a romantic relationship. When Pharus and David are caught kissing by JR, David hits Pharus.

At the end of the play, the audience and Pharus find out that David has now been excluded from school. and Pharus, along with AJ, JR and Bobby, graduate.

#### CONTENT GUIDANCE

Choir Boy contains the use of strong racial and homophobic slurs that have been carefully rehearsed to reduce the impact of them on the cast. Some scenes include moments of physical violence and some include sexual intimacy.

# **TYPES OF ACTION & KEY SCENES**

#### **MOVEMENT** \*

There are moments when the performers dance or move quickly around the space and the action onstage can be fast-paced.

#### LOUD NOISES

On Relaxed Performance days, we lower the volume of sound certain effects, but there may still be a few loud ones. There are moments where the audience might make loud noises like clapping. The actors sometimes sing on stage but they will not have microphones.

#### SADNESS (%)

There are moments when the characters get a bit cross, sad or frustrated. They may shout and their faces and movements will show how they feel. Some of these scenes of sadness can be upsetting.

As mentioned below, there are some loud noises in the play, or moments where the characters might seem angry or cross. These scenes have been practiced many times to make sure everyone is safe. We have put below the times when these scenes take place.

#### 57 MINS INTO ACT 1 (S) (3)



Bobby appears cross, and throws his rucksack on the floor, which may make a loud noise.

#### 27 MINS INTO ACT 2 😂 🛪



Mr Pendleton gets cross at Bobby and grabs his jacket.

#### 32 MINS INTO ACT 2 (S)



David hits Pharus, although this happens in the showers and can't be seen by the audience. There may be a loud noise. Afterwards Pharus may look hurt, but this has been done with makeup.

### **SET AND LIGHTING**

The majority of the action that takes place on stage happens in two different locations - the classroom and the the shower rooms. These are pictured below.
